



From Manchester, N.H.:

Take Rte. 114 to Goffstown.
In Goffstown turn left onto Rte. 13 toward New Boston.
In New Boston turn right at second stop sign following signs to Rte. 136 and Francetown.

➔ At junction of Rtes 136 and 77 bear left onto Rte. 136.
Four miles on right is a sign for Kingsbury Hill, take right turn on Dennison Pond Rd. 1/4 mile bear right at the fork, continue up hill another mile. Road will end at Kingsbury Hill.

From Nashua, N.H.:

From Rte. 3 take exit 8, at third light turn right onto Rte. 101-A towards Milford.
At the Milford rotary turn right then continue straight onto Rte. 13 north toward Mount Vernon. Continue through Mount Vernon into New Boston.
Follow directions from ➔ above.

From Keene, N.H.:

Follow Rte. 101 East towards Peterborough turn left after lights following signs for Rte. 202 and Greenfield.
1.5 miles turn right onto Rte. 136 towards Greenfield.
Follow Rte. 136 through Greenfield into Francetown.
In Francetown continue on Rte. 136.
From Francetown center 4 miles on left is sign for Kingsbury Hill, take left (Dennison Pond Rd.)
1/4 mile bear right at fork, continue up hill another mile, road will end at Kingsbury Hill.

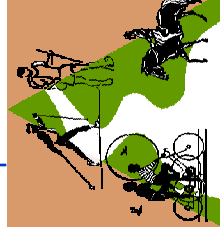

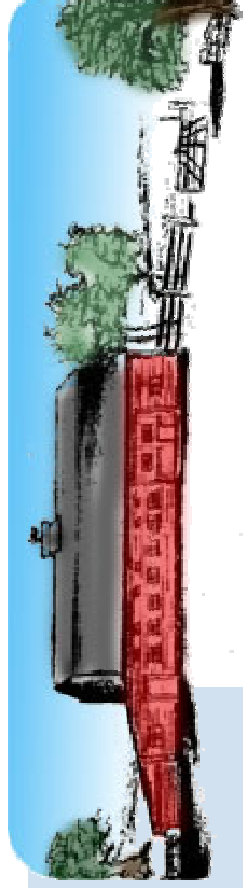
Kingsbury Hill

Conservation

New England Forestry Foundation and the Russell Foundation are working with the Kingsbury Hill owners to place the entire farm in conservation, excluding the buildings and enough land to build more barns, before it is sold to a buyer interested in keeping the land for horses and/or farming.

Since 1968, the Sanderson and Campbell families have had a long-standing commitment to the education of young equestrians via their very popular Kingsbury Hill Riding Camp. In addition, Kingsbury Hill became fully sanctioned by the United States Eventing Association and held yearly events at the farm.

Kingsbury Hill Farm has beautiful hilltop fields, jumps and trails throughout the property and is situated at the corner where New Boston, Francestown and Weare meet.



Placing this farm in conservation will preserve its open spaces, forests and trails forever.

The conservation of this property will provide many benefits to the surrounding communities including

- Access to approximately 150 acres of woodlands and fields
- Miles of trails and pathways
- Open land and wildlife preservation



Equestrians of all ages and disciplines have many fond memories of time spent enjoying this unique facility. Consider spending some

time now to preserve the rich history of this area of Francestown for coming generations.



Kingsbury Hill Mounted Benefit Event

PISCATAQUOG AREA TRAILWAYS will hold a 12 mile trail ride "with optional fences" to benefit the conservation of the Kingsbury Hill farmland (approximately 150 acres) on Dennison Pond Road in Francestown.

This year's ride will explore trails with varied terrain around Pleasant Pond, Francestown and will offer 275 degrees of mountain views to the north and west of Kingsbury Hill. 90% of the ride will be on trails through very shady woods. Only 1/2 mile of pavement on a rural road by Pleasant Pond with good shoulder, access to the pond for horse water, one mile of gravel road and a short trail through a logging area comprise the rest of the ride. Snack stop included. Selected Kingsbury Hill jumps will be available before or after the trail ride, rider's preference.
